The Ethics and Leadership Track asks the question: How can we build institutional systems and cultures that empower individuals and organizations for ethical action, empathy, teamwork, leadership and influence? The Track will address this question along three dimensions: Laying the Foundations, Building Ecosystems, and Bridging the Gaps. The theme Laying the Foundations addresses the need for people to develop skills in ethical action, ethical analysis, and ethical awareness throughout their educational and professional lives-from the playground to the boardroom. The theme Building Ecosystems emphasizes forming partnerships between higher education institutions and private, public, and nonprofit organizations to better understand and prepare young people for the real-world leadership and ethics environment they will face when they enter the workforce and ascend into positions of leadership on the continent. Finally, the theme Bridging the Gaps aims to highlight what is missing from ethics and leadership conversations when the future horizon is pushed 50 or 100 years from today.
