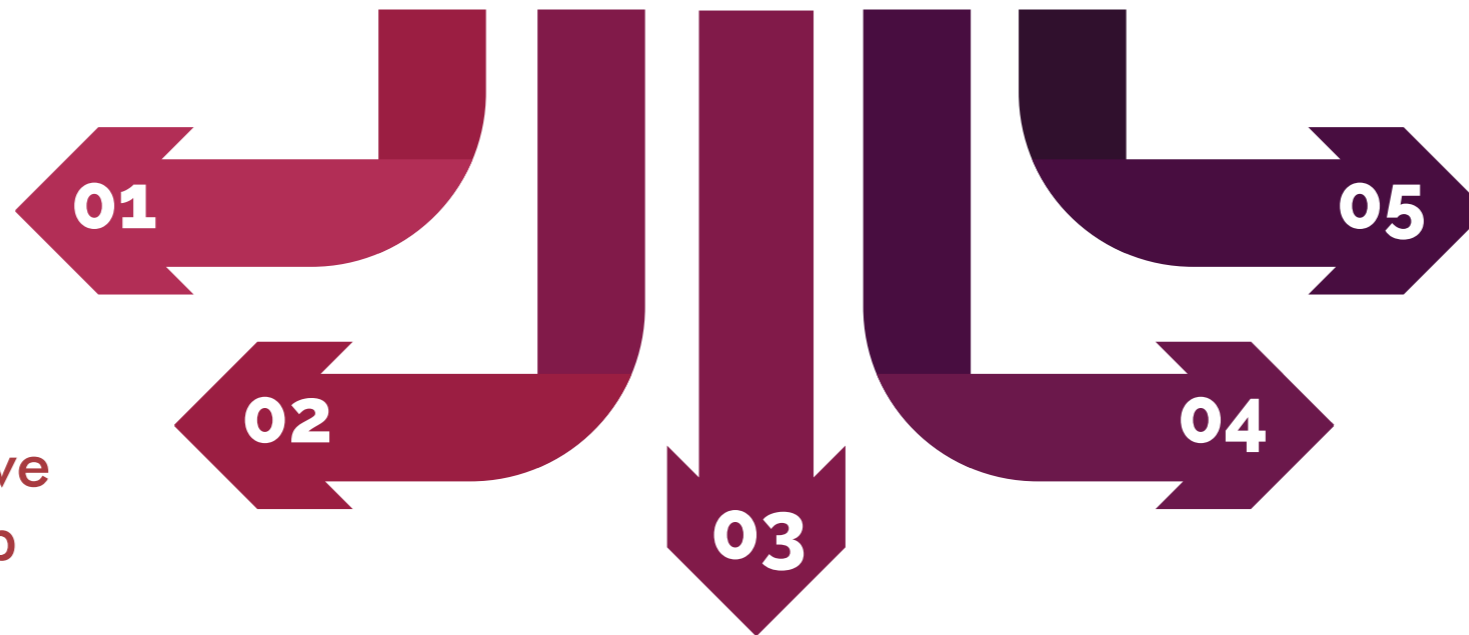

SYSTEMS CHANGE PROGRAM - EMPLOYABILITY (SCP-E)

The Systems Change Program for Employability is designed to help HEIs develop career-ready students and improve employability outcomes of graduates.

It is a transformational process designed to fundamentally develop components and structures of key career-related systems in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).

- 3. Increase the placement rate of participating institutions' graduating students to an average of 70% within 2 years of graduating.**
