About The West Africa Hub

The West Africa Hub started in June 2022 to bring together institutions based in West Africa to collaborate, share ideas and inspire one another to achieve excellent student outcomes for the sub-region. The mandate of the hub is to drive West African-centered and context-specific engagement within The Education Collaborative. The hub is driven by anchor and exemplar institutions that commit resources, share their blueprint of success and expertise to support other institutions in the sub-region to develop their systems and operations. The hub's initiatives are governed by its Strategic and Technical Committees.

So far, the hub has reached thirty-six institutions from seven countries in West Africa.

The hub is hosted by Pan-Atlantic University.

The objective of education at Pan-Atlantic University (PAU) is the well-rounded formation of the human person. The University aims at nurturing individuals who are professionally competent, creative and enterprising, zealous for the common good and able to make free and morally right decisions and who thus act as positive agents of change in service to society.

The founders of Pan-Atlantic University were inspired to begin this educational project by the teachings of Saint Josemaría Escrivá, who was the founder of Opus Dei, an institution of the Catholic Church. PAU has seven main units: Lagos Business School (LBS), Enterprise Development Centre (EDC), School of Media and Communication (SMC), School of Management and Social Sciences (SMSS), School of Science and Technology (SST), Institute of Humanities (IOH) and Yemisi Shyllon Museum of Art (YSMA).
